Early Childhood partnership recognized



Nisonger receives communication grant

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Institute on Deafness and other Communication Disorders awarded a 3-year \$468,000 grant to The Ohio State University Nisonger Center at the Wexner Medical Center. The Grant will support the measurement of social communication outcomes in young children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD).

"I am excited that this project will bring together parents, teachers, and experts in the field to work toward creating an assessment tool that improves our ability to measure change in social communication," said Katie Walton, PhD; Program Director for Nisonger Center's Early Learning Program, Assistant Professor of Psychology and Psychiatry and principal investigator.

Social communication skills lay a foundation for the development of communicative competence and healthy social relationships across the lifespan. This grant will allow Nisonger to focus on the development of items to better measure social communication in 2-6 year olds with ASD. The resulting assessment tools will be designed to measure social communication effectively across young children with ASD who have different developmental and language skills, making these useful tools to track the outcomes of early intervention.

The mission of The Ohio State University Nisonger Center, part of Wexner Medical Center's Neurological Institute, is to improve the lives of people with developmental disabilities and their families.
